Proposed Administrative Procedure For Detachment Level Award Selection Criteria

The nomination criteria will be presented to the detachment at a regular monthly meeting. Members of the detachment will make nominations for all awards to the detachment Board of Trustees, here after referred to as the Board, via email with documentation backing up the selection criteria.

The Commandant will determine who compiles the "List of Nominees" (an Elected Officer or the Detachment Adjutant). The Board will review the list and make the selection based on member's input and their own observations of the nominees. Should two or more nominees have similar qualifications, in the case of "Marine of the Year" the nominees will be presented to the membership for a vote. The Board will consider multiple nominees for the other awards. Should the Board determine that only one award will be given, the nominees would be presented to the membership for a vote.

This proposed Award selection criteria should be used for nominating a member, associate member, family member of detachment member or associate, or any non-League member as agreed to by the awards committee. The nominee should be considered for any and all activities not necessarily for regular attendance to monthly meetings.

Being an Elected or Appointed Officer of the Detachment is an honor. Those members who are elected or appointed should receive their appropriate medal and ribbon at the installation ritual. Any actions of an officer above and beyond the duties of the office held will be taken into consideration, with the exception of the Detachment Commandant. A standing Commandant will NOT be recognized/decorated while serving, if the actions for the decoration fall during his/her tenure. Once he/she vacates the position, then an award can be recommended.

A candidate for Detachment_Marine of the Year must be active regular member of Detachment 1260, not necessarily an officer of the detachment. Consideration should also be given for possible nomination at the Department or National Levels.

A candidate for the Distinguished Citizenship and/or Service Award should also be an active regular member within the detachment, not necessarily an officer of the detachment. Consideration should also be given for possible nomination at the Department Level.
